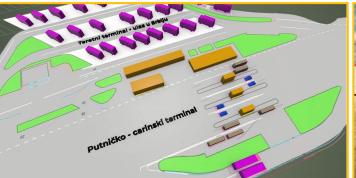


2014-2020 CLOSURE - ACHIEVEMENTS

- 5 strategic projects were concluded successfully, 118 normal projects implemented and 8 TA projects administered
- 8 border crossing points improved
- 180 608 meters of improved water management systems!
- 109 811 visits per years supported sites of cultural and natural heritage
- Above 1 100 events contributed to the projects' and the programme's visibility











2014-2020 CLOSURE - ACHIEVEMENTS

- 226 enterprises cooperated with research institutions, 476 further organisations participated in knowledge platforms
- 386 months spent in scholarships
- 1.5 million persons of the region benefited from flood protection measures
- Surface area with better conservation status summed up to 162 956.35 hectares
- 4.53 km of roads and 26.87 km new bicycle paths were built and 14 km of roads got reconstructed

THE FUTURE OF INTERREG

Overview of the Legal Framework of the Programming Period beyond 2028



Status of the Drafting Process of The Relevant Legislations

- Draft legislation package was published in July 2025
- Observational process is on-going: internal and international levels (possibility of discussion with other Interreg programmes)
- Discussion started among Managing Authority, National Authority, Joint Secretariat, Audit Authority and the relevant units of the Széchenyi Program Office and revelant line ministries: internal and joint platforms
- Legislations can be finalised until end of 2027



Regulation Proposals with Interreg-relevance

- "NRP" Regulation: Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing the European Economic, Territorial, Social, Rural and Maritime Sustainable Prosperity and Security Fund for the period 2028-2034 and amending Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2024/2509 (Proposal)
- <u>Interreg specific regulation:</u> Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing the European Regional Development Fund and Cohesion Fund as part of the National and Regional Partnership Fund (Proposal)
- <u>Global Europe:</u> Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing Global Europe (Proposal)
- <u>Performance Regulation:</u> Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a budget expenditure tracking and performance framework and other rules for the Union programmes and activities (Proposal)



"NRP" Regulation

Main aspects: "Common Rulebook"

- Sets out common provisions for [nine] shared management funds at EU level.
- The majority of delivery and implementation rules of the ERDF and the Cohesion Fund are covered in Regulation (EU) [NRP Regulation].



Interreg specific regulation

Main aspects: Regional development, Interreg Plan

- This Regulation defines provisions applicable to both the ERDF and the Cohesion Fund, including for "European territorial cooperation" (Interreg).
- Regarding Interreg, greater harmonisation and more robust means of coordination across different EU funding streams were identified as key areas for future improvement.
- Introduction of the "Interreg Plan": one Interreg Plan with a wide eligibility scope and a single set of rules.



Global Europe

Main aspects: Definitions for cross-border cooperations

Article 2 – Definitions

"cross-border cooperation means cooperation between: (a) Member States, one or more partner countries along the external adjacent land and maritime borders of the Union; (b) two or more candidates or potential candidates covered under the Europe pillar"

Article 28 – Cross-Border Cooperation

"Up to 3% of the financial envelope for the pillars […] may be indicatively allocated to support those programmes"



Performance Regulation

Main aspects: Common indicators

- This Regulation establishes an expenditure tracking and a performance framework for the budget, including rules on the monitoring of all budget expenditure, monitoring and reporting on the performance of Union programmes and activities, and rules for the evaluation of the programmes and activities.
- Common indicators are provided under the Performance Regulation.
- The performance of the Fund will be monitored through the performance framework provided in the Performance Regulation proposed alongside the present regulation, including through the common list of intervention fields and output and result indicators. (measures; milestones, target)

- Interreg Plan
- Interreg Allocation

Interreg Plan

- Simplifying the current framework moving from close to 540 programmes to 27 National and Regional Partnership Plans and <u>one Interreg Plan</u>, with a wide eligibility scope and a single set of rules, will reduce administrative costs at all levels, while facilitating access to funding for EU businesses, including SMEs, local authorities and project promoters and keeping the focus on reducing regional disparities.
- The Interreg Plan shall include <u>Interreg Plan chapters</u>. Each chapter shall correspond to cooperation in a given geographical area. Each chapter shall:
 - provide a list and description of measures
 - define milestones and targets
 - > determine indicators proposed for the targets
 - right set out the total estimated costs in line with the principle of cost efficiency, sound financial management and commensurate to the expected economic and social impact



Interreg allocation

National contribution to estimated costs

NRP Regulation, Article 20

• The national contribution rate at the level of each Interreg chapter shall be <u>no lower than 20%</u>. The rate shall be decreased <u>by [5] percentage points</u> for chapters supporting outermost regions' cooperation and <u>cross-border cooperation on external borders</u>.



Objectives

- General objectives of the Fund NRP Regulation, Article 2
- Specific objectives of the Fund NRP Regulation, Article 3
- Five high level objectives:
 - 1. Europe's sustainable prosperity across all regions;
 - 2. Europe's defence capabilities and security;
 - 3. supporting people, strengthening Europe's societies and Europe's social model;
 - 4. sustaining Europe's quality of life;
 - protecting and strengthening democracy, rule of law and upholding Union values.



Institutional conditions

- Interreg Plan will be implemented under shared management.
- The Member State hosting the prospective managing authority shall submit an Interreg Plan chapter to the Commission.
- The managing authority may identify one or more intermediate bodies to carry out certain tasks under their responsibility.
- Joint Secretariat (no changes)
- Audit Authority (no changes)
- MC: A monitoring committee shall be established for each Interreg Plan chapter. The
 monitoring committee shall be responsible for selection of Interreg operations, in
 accordance with the Interreg Plan chapter's strategy and objectives. (The
 Commission may lay down further requirements to be met by the monitoring
 committee in the respective implementing act).



Summary of new rules and main differences

- More allocated funds for Interreg in the frame of the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF)
- Interreg Regulation defined together with ERDF Regulation
- Different distribution mechanism within Interreg
- Interreg Plan and Interreg chapters instead of IPs
- Performance based system
- Allocation methodology proposal! is the same as in 21-27

2ND CfP – DURATION AND BUDGET

Project duration

Project implementation period must not be less than 6 months.

- For Small-scale projects (SSP) the project must not exceed 18 months
- For Regular-scale projects (RSP) the project must not exceed 24 months

Project budget

Budget A – staff, office and administration, travel costs are flat rate; services, equipment and works are real costs For SSP there will be an option

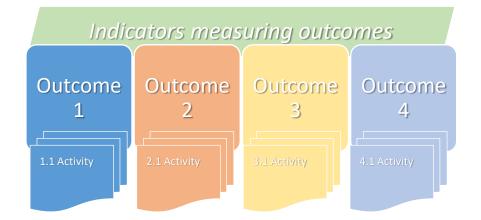
Budget B – option only to SSP applications, where staff cost is real cost and the rest is a flat rate of 40% of staff costs – primarily for softer projects without equipment and infrastructure and more staff.



2ND CfP – INDICATORS, PROJECT LOGIC

Programme objective

Project objective



The project's objective must fit to one of the programme's objectives.

Activities should lead to accomplishment of the set objective.

Activities are grouped in such way that each group leads to an **outcome**, which is measured by at least one **indicator**.

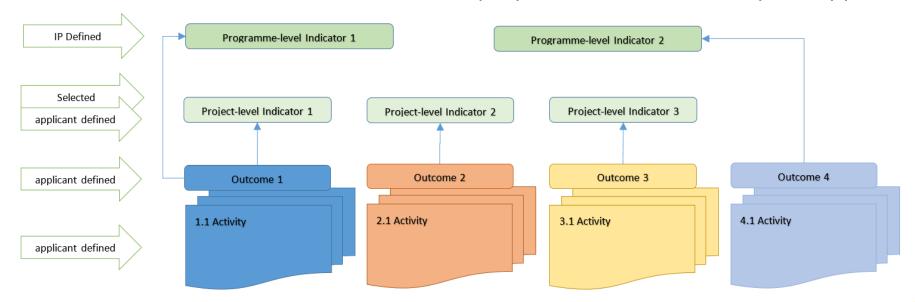
Each activity must be necessary, purposeful and logically coherent with other activities, which lead to a joint outcome. The outcome, on the other hand, must be tangible and measurable by at least one indicator.



2ND CfP – INDICATOR TYPES AND THEIR ROLE

Programme-level indicators: defined by the Programme and will be reported by partners to the programme and then summarised and reported by the Programme to the EC on a regular basis. Some output Programme-level indicators are paired with result Programme-level indicators that are measured and reported generally in the follow-up period.

Project-level indicators: either selected from our proposed list or defined by the applicants.

EOE – BUDGET TYPE A / FLAT RATE STAFF

Budget type A is open to any project partners

FLAT RATES - OBLIGATORY

- Staff costs 20% of direct costs (maximum EUR 100 000)
- Office and administration 15% of staff cost
- Travel and accommodation 15% of staff cost

REAL COSTS - OBLIGATORY

- External expertise and services (except for communication lump sum)
- Equipment
- Infrastructure and works



EOE – BUDGET TYPE B / REAL COST STAFF

ONLY FOR SSP APPLICATIONS

REAL COSTS for Staff costs, **FLAT RATE** for costs other than staff costs, calculated as 40% of Staff costs.

- Full-time in the project (who works 100 % of the working time on a project);
- Part-time in the project (who works additionally in other projects or fulfils non-project related duties in the company):
 - Part-time with a fixed percentage of time per month dedicated to the project
 - Part-time with a flexible number of hours worked per month on the project
- Contracted for project purposes on an hourly basis

Audit trail:

- Staff costs
- Obligatory visibility elements

2ND CfP – BASIC SELECTION CRITERIA

"Quality assessment" means assessment of quality, capacity, activity eligibility, relevance, budget and other aspects of the application. Each application that passes the previous step(s) will be assessed on the following criteria by external expert assessors and the joint secretariat staff:

Section	Maximum score	Minimum score
Financial and operational capacity of the partnership	17	8
Relevance, project content and CBC effect	31	15
Methodology (Work plan)	31	10
Budget, sustainability	21	7
	Total: 100	Min. to pass: 50



2ND CfP – CLARIFICATION MEETING

Chapter 11.6 of the GfA:

Before the conclusion of the subsidy contract for EU contribution, programme managers from the JS will initiate a **Project Content and Indicator Clarification Meeting** with the partners: either online or in person at the premises of the lead partner/partners or the representatives of the partnership will be invited for a visit to the premises of the JS.

The main goal of this meeting is to clarify the content, activities and budget with special attention to the indicators and horizontal principles, without altering the substance of the original application. The result of the meeting would be a finalized project form with updated budget explanations, reallocated budget items and clarified indicators. The JS will have the mandate of the MC to make necessary corrections of indicators, activities, budget, and any other elements of the project that were misunderstood or not properly planned in the application form. The quality assessors' opinions would be taken into account at this point.
